Train2Validate is a project.

Train2Validate is a short form

for Professional training for easy-to-read facilitators and validators.

The project number is 2020-1-ES01-KA203-082068.

The European Commission supports Train2Validate.

Train2Validate is about Easy-to-Read texts.

And Train2Validate is also about the persons

who test if texts are easy to understand.

These persons are **facilitators** and **validators**.

Validators are persons with reading difficulties.

Validators read a text.

Then, they say:

- Yes, the text is easy-to-read. Or
- No, the text needs changes.

Validators work with **facilitators**.

Facilitators help validators during the tests.

Facilitators are persons without reading difficulties.

What do we do in Train2Validate?

We are creating two courses.

One is for people who want to become a facilitator.

The other course is for people
who wants to become a validator.

The courses are free

and they will be ready in August 2023.
