1. INTRODUCTION

The third Multiplier Event (ME3) — *International seminar on Easy-to-Read language* — of the TRAIN2VALIDATE project was organized face-to-face, on April 7, 2022, by Scuola Superiore per Mediatori Linguistici, Pisa, in collaboration with Accademia Giuseppe Aliprandi - Flaviano Rodriguez and Associazione "onA.I.R.". The venue was Scuola Superiore per Mediatori Linguistici (SSML), Pisa.

2. AIM

The main aim of the event was disseminating the curricula for the training of validators and facilitators of Easy-to-Read texts. The event included a workshop and a conference, in order to present the bases of easy-to-read writing and to draw attention to the professional, social, and educational challenges of Easy-to-Read writing and validating. The program of the event is detailed in Section 4 and presented in Annex 1.

3. DISSEMINATION

The ME3 dissemination strategy consisted in advertising the event on a multitude of channels, including the project's website, the T2V mailing list, social and professional networks (Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn), and a press release from the partners' institutions. Moreover, the project was advertised on the personal networks of the project members.





A significant aspect of the dissemination strategy consisted in inviting to the event people directly involved with Easy-to-Read and/or reading and learning difficulties and disabilities. Additionally, when disseminating the event, it was pointed out that the event was free, but places were limited, that speakers were going to speak in English and Italian, and that certificates of participation would be offered to all participants. Lastly, Covid restrictions for the event were specified at the end of the program.

The languages of dissemination were Italian and English. A selection of the dissemination examples is presented below:




Figure 2. Section of the website dedicated to the dissemination of the event




Figure 4. News in Twitter

La creazione di un curriculum per la formazione di validatori e facilitatori di testi in lingua facile rappresenta per noi un grande successo e permette a chiunque abbia difficoltà di lettura o apprendimento di svolgere il proprio ruolo nella società". La mattina, un workshop sulla lingua facile da leggere e da capire permetterà ai partecipanti di apprendere le basi di questo linguaggio accessibile e inclusivo. Nel pomeriggio, i partner del progetto illustreranno i risultati fin qui raggiunti e discuteranno dei prossimi passi da compiere. La conferenza verterà principalmente sulla presentazione dei curricula per validatori e facilitatori, ma offrirà anche una panoramica sul lavoro da svolgere nei prossimi 18 mesi: la creazione e valutazione del materiale didattico e la certificazione riconosciuta a livello europeo. Inoltre, i partner annunceranno la pubblicazione di un libro contenente i risultati di un questionario sull'attuale prassi della validazione in Europa. Si tratta di due nuove professioni il cui compito è assicurare che testi di varia natura siano accessibili a tutti. 4. DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENT

The event was organized face-to-face on April 7, 2022. The one-day program included two sessions, a workshop in the morning and a conference in the afternoon, presented in detail in what follows.

The event was opened by official addresses given by Monika Pelz, Director of Studies of SSML. She stressed the importance of building an inclusive society, where everyone can have the same opportunities and claimed that SSML Pisa wanted to give its contribution to such an interesting and international project. She also opened the morning session by presenting speakers and guests and explained how the event was going to be structured: a workshop in the morning, and a conference in the afternoon.




Figure 9. Guidelines for writing in E2R Óscar García Muñoz, Plena Inclusión Madrid, Spain

The audience participated actively during the event, during the workshop and with questions for the panellists. All presentations from speakers are available in annex 3 of the report.

5. PARTICIPATION AND IMPACT

Two registration forms were opened (Italian and English). 23 persons from 4 countries registered in the Italian form and 27 persons from 13 countries registered in the English form. Finally, 22 persons from 6 countries, including members of the consortium, (15 Italy, 1 Belgium, 1 Hungary, 2 Lithuania, 1 Russia, 2 Morocco) attended the event. Additionally, 1 panellist (Floriana Sciumbata) participated online through Zoom, as well as Sara Ramos Pinto who is a member of the advisory board. The number of the actual participants does not include the attendees from the project partners' institutions or organizations.

All participants and speakers received a paperback certificate of attendance and by mail the ones who participated online.

The impact and visibility of the event were also insured by a series of actions posting and commenting in real time on social platforms (Facebook and Twitter). Additionally, all participants received a leaflet about the project, a program and the text for the workshop.


Posting and commenting live on social platforms during the event.

As the event was celebrated under the restrictions due to the Covid pandemic, certain measures for general health security were adopted:

- Availability of hygienic gel
- Compulsory use of face mask
- A seat of separation between attendants
- Regular microphone cleaning
- One way circulation inside the building to avoid people crossing coming in and going out.
- Information with rules and recommendations for all attendants.
- Separation in groups for coffee break and catering and celebration of both in an open-air space.

7. SATISFACTION SURVEY












Figure 22. Charts with the results of the satisfaction survey of the event


